To ensure responsiveness to the NOTICE Bidders to take note of the following requirements (Compliance Evaluation):

1. Service providers must be registered on National Treasury’s Central Supplier Database and submit a summary report as proof of registration or alternatively reflect the CSD supplier number on their proposal;
2. All prospective/interested suppliers should complete the MBD 4, MBD 8 and MBD 9 forms which may be obtained from the BCMDA website: www.bcmda.org.za;
3. All prices must be inclusive of VAT, where applicable;
4. Use of Tippex and erasable ink will render the bid non- responsive
5. Bidders are required to submit valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE rating claims, failing which will result in a status level score of zero be assigned to the tenderer; a joint venture, trust or consortium; must submit a consolidated B-BBEE status level verification certificate.
6. Bidders must submit confirmation that the bidder’s municipal accounts are not in arrears for a period exceeding 3 months. Such confirmation must be for the company must be as follows:

13. BCMDA will not take responsibility for incorrectly delivered bids sent by courier. It is the bidder's responsibility to make sure that their quotation is correctly delivered in the tender box on or before the closing date of this notice;
14. The proposal or quotation must demonstrate the requirements detailed on the specifications below.
15. NO QUOTATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED FROM PERSONS IN THE SERVICE OF THE STATE AS DEFINED IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT MUNICIPAL FINANCE MANAGEMENT ACT 56 OF 2003: MUNICIPAL SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

ASSESSMENT OF STAKEHOLDER OPINIONS ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE BEACHFRONT AND QUIGNEY AREA

The Buffalo City Metropolitan Development Agency (BCMDA) is calling for formal written proposals for appointment of a professional service provider to assess stakeholder opinions on the current state of Quigney and beachfront area and propose interventions to make the area more attractive to visitors and potential investors.

1. Project Scope and Deliverables

The successful service provider will be contracted to undertake the following functions:

Task 1:

- Analyse the Spatial Development Framework of the Quigney area and provide high level summary of key observations.

Task 2:

- Using the map of Quigney, identify specific quadrants within the area and map out a number of targeted research participants per quadrant.
- Develop an approach and a research instrument intended to obtain primary data on the following:
 - ✓ The number of people visiting the beachfront and Quigney area.
 - ✓ Reasons for visits
 - ✓ Frequency of visits
 - ✓ Days of visits
 - ✓ Key attractions to the beachfront
 - ✓ Mode of travelling to the beachfront.
 - ✓ Opinions on the current state of beachfront and facilities.
 - ✓ Proposed developments to improve the beachfront and Quigney area.
 - ✓ Additions to make the area more exciting and appealing to visitors.
 - ✓ Business impressions on operating in the Quigney area.
 - ✓ Number and profile of businesses operating in the Quigney area.

The minimum number of the participants should be 120. Provide a demographic profile of the participants.

Task 3:

- Develop a spatial map of the beachfront and Quigney and engage participants to solicit opinions on the proposed activities according to sites considering the current use and proposed future use.

Task 4:

- Analyse findings using tables, graphs and narratives and develop a brief profile of each proposed development. Submit a comprehensive professional report with graphics and layout as well as a summary version in a PowerPoint format.

Task 5:

- Identify and profile investment opportunities in the Quigney area.

Task 6:

- Engage with 10 property owners in the Quigney area to secure approval for the development of public art(murals) on their properties. These properties must be strategically located for this kind of work.

2. Minimum Competency Requirements

The successful bidder must provide copies of qualifications and professional registration documents (where applicable) in the following fields:

- Project Management
 - Town Planning
- Failure to provide copies of qualifications and professional registration documents will result in the bid being non-responsive. **Registration as candidates will NOT be considered.**

The project timeframe is three months, Reporting (including regular project monitoring and progress feedback meetings with the employer) will be done on a bi-weekly basis.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
